Jičín – Resümee

Das Gebiet von Jičín (Jitschin) hat sich seit dem Mittelalter, als es zusammenhängend besiedelt wurde, sehr verändert, die hiesige Landschaft blieb jedoch fast bis in die heutigen Tage kaum beschädigt erhalten – ohne irreversible Eingriffe, Beeinträchtigungen der Industrie, Verkehrsverbindungen und Massentouristik. Man kann sagen, dass die Landschaft der Stadt Jičín und ihrer Umgebung eine vormoderne Landschaft sei, dass sie sich die Majestät, Poetik und Intimität behält.

Jičín ist im wahren Sinne des Wortes eine Stadt in der Landschaft. Die Stadt ist mit der Natur in der Umgebung durch Zugänge in die Landschaft verbunden, worauf man ohne Hindernisüberwindungen und ohne Verkehrsmittel in die freie Natur gelangen kann, und auch mit malerischen Durchblicken auf die Dominanten in der Umgebung verknüpft. Dieses Prinzip des Landschaftsillusionismus übertrugen gefühlvolle Urbanisten der ersten Hälfte des 20. Jahrhunderts in die Konzeption der Stadtentwicklung.

Die Stadt Jičín entwickelte sich mit seinen frühbarocken Dominanten zu einem bedeutenden Merkmal, das mit der nahen Umgebung in Verbindung trat, ja bereits in der Auffassung von Albrecht von Waldstein. Waldsteins bis heutzutage zum Großteil erhalten gebliebene Landschaftskomposition, basierend auf genauen astronomischen Berechnungen, gehört zu den Denkmälern europäischer Bedeutung. Jedoch nicht nur die Naturschönheiten und die großartige, prunkhafte Ordnung, welche dem Jitschiner Talkessel Waldsteins italienische Architekten prägten, bilden den Genius loci der Stadt Jičín und deren Umgebung. Gefühlvoll, bescheiden und unauffällig zierten die Landschaft besonders im südlichen Teil des Jitschiner Talkessels winzige Denkmäler – Kapellen, Kreuze und Marterln, die länger als die eleganten und großzügigen Kirchen- oder Wirtschaftsbauwerke aus der Zeit des Hoch- und Spätbarocks entdeckt werden müssen. Die historische Landschaft, die über ihre Vergangenheit aussagt, prägten auch Kreuze auf den Gräbern der Gefallenen im preußisch-österreichischen Krieg 1866. Der historische Atlas der Stadt Jičín enthält eine Auswahl von ikonographischen und kartographischen Belegen, die für die Entwicklung und Veränderung der Stadttagglomeration in der Vergangenheit wichtig sind. Die Verfasser konzentrierten sich auf die Entwicklung der Stadt aus der urbanistischen Sicht, aus der Sicht der Architektur und der Eingliederung der Stadt in die Landschaft, weil, wie die Bibliographie belegt, die Stadtgeschichte bereits mehrmals fachmännisch und sachlich bearbeitet wurde.

Die Stadt Jičín liegt in Ostböhmen inmitten des Jitschiner Talkessels in einem Gebiet, wo die geringfügig gewellte Ebene durch parallel in West-Ost-Richtung sich erhebend ziehende Kämme zum Grenzzug des Riesengebirges unterbrochen wird. Im Südwesten begrenzt den Talkessel der Loretto- und Veliš-Kamm (429m ü. M.), nordwestlich von Jičín in Richtung Sobotka befinden sich die Ausläufer der Prachower Felsen mit der wichtigsten Höhenkote Brada (438m ü. M.) und dem höchsten Gipfel Přívýšina (463m ü. M.). Die bewaldeten Felsenstädte der Prachower Felsen wurden seit der jüngeren Steinzeit von Trägern urzeitiger und frühmittelalterlicher Kulturen aufgesucht. Der Talkessel ist vom Nordwesten vor den überwiegenden Wind- und Niederschlagsrichtungen durch eine wesentliche Überhöhung des Terrains mit dem dominierenden Hügel Tábor (678m ü. M.) und weiteren Gipfeln mit Ruinen mittelalterlicher Burgen (Kumburk, Bradlec) geschützt. Während die ersten zwei Kämme geomorphologisch zu dem Jitschiner Hügelland (Subprovinz der Böhmisches Tafel, Gebiet Nordböhmische Tafel) gehören, wird der merkbar höhere Hügel Tábor (Bestandteil der Jeschken-Kozákov Kammes) genauso wie die nächste geomorphologische Einheit, die in die Gegend von Jičín eingreift – das Riesengebirgsvorland – zu der Riesengebirgs-Gesenke-Subprovinz zugeordnet.

Jičín (Marktplatz 270m ü. M.) wurde – nach der Übertragung aus der heutigen Ortschaft Staré Místo am Fuße des Velišer Kamms – auf die Grenzscheide dieser zwei unterschiedlichen Gebiete am Rande der Terraformation, von Wasser umspült und von dem Fluss Cidline umflossen, ausgesetzt. Sein Quellengebiet erstreckt sich zwischen den westlichen Abhängen des Berges Tábor und den östlichen Abhängen des Berges Kozákov in Meereshöhe von ungefähr 552 Metern. Jičín und seine unmittelbare Umgebung entwässern weiter zwei Bäche: Holinský und Svatováclavský potok. Das ganze Gebiet gehört in das Einzugsgebiet der Elbe. Bald nach der Stadtgründung wurden am Fluss Cidline Teiche errichtet. Der Grund dazu war außer wirtschaftlichen Bedürfnissen die Bodenentwässerung – die Sohle des Gebietes von Jičín bildet der das Wasser undurchlässige Plänerkalkstein. Einige große Teiche, wohin das Wasser von den Feldern und aus den Wäldern rinnt, haben sich in der Nähe der Stadt bis heute erhalten.

Die urzeitige und frühmittelalterliche Besiedlung der Gegend von Jičín konzentrierte sich auf Lößböden und -wehen, auf Braunerden mitteleuropäischen Typs und auf Sandböden in den Prachower Felsen und ihrer unmittelbaren Umgebung. Warme Lagen mit sehr intensiver Besiedlung in der Urzeit und im Mittelalter waren die Abhänge der Basalthügel, die aus dem sanft gewellten Jitschiner Talkessel hervortreten, überdeckt von Lößböden – das breite und seichte Tal zwischen den Basalthügeln vulkanischen Ursprungs Zebín (auspräparierter Basaltkrater, 399m ü. M.) und Čeřovka (334m ü. M.). Jičín selbst wurde auf einer Stelle ohne urzeitige oder frühmittelalterliche Besiedlung
